At a meeting in April 2015, the Laws Representation Group (LRG) considered the areas of the Game where, it had been agreed that Law amendments were not required but that current Law was to be enforced by match officials.



These have been re-stated and reviewed during the current Rugby Championship and the RWC warm-up games.

	I have been asked to circulate details of a Match Observer app which is the first app specifically designed to provide clear and structured reports on a referee's performance during a game.
	Gerry O'Leary, the App's developer adds, 'a comment received during the
	pre-release testing phase was "this app may be the way to encourage the 'digital generation' of referee's to step up
	and become an observer". Hopefully this will ease the way forward for referees to start putting something back into the societies as their own careers with the whistle come to an end.
3.1	Another benefit is all the information and data is collated and presented in a clear format as the game progresses so there is an opportunity for the observer to complete the report within a short time of the end of the game and thus "get their Sunday back" and not have to spend hours in front of a PC transferring the data and writing a report."
